Guidelines

Description of the 34th Annual Scientific Sessions:

The Eastern Nursing Research Society is pleased to accept abstracts to be considered for presentation at the ENRS 34th Annual Scientific Sessions. This year's theme is *Charting the Path of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Through Nursing Science*.

The 34th Annual Scientific Sessions appeal to all individuals interested in advancing nursing science, including nurse researchers, leaders in evidence-based practice, and dedicated nursing science students and faculty.

2022 Conference Objectives:

- Evaluate the impact of existing and emerging nursing knowledge focused on health equity to meet the needs of a diverse society.
- Discuss transformative nursing research that addresses equitable and accessible care across populations.
- Develop strategies to disseminate and implement nursing science that promotes diversity, health equity and inclusion.

General Information:

ENRS is offering individual member clinical or community-based organizations the opportunity to select an emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholar from their organization who are *lead authors* to share emerging research/scholarship by presenting a poster at the **34th Annual Scientific Sessions**.

Individual member clinical and community-based organizations are invited to select one emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholar poster abstract for submission using the guidelines specified below. The lead author clinical nurse should be early in their research/scholarship trajectory and may be prepared at any educational degree level, including post-doctoral fellows.

Please note: It is the responsibility of each clinical or community-based organization to select the poster abstract, *not* the clinical nurse researcher/scholar. Once selected by their clinical or community-based organization, the *lead clinical nurse researcher/scholar author* should submit their abstract in the online system.

****There is no fee for submitting these abstracts.***

ENRS Membership: The lead authors of all clinical or community-based organization selected emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholar poster presentations must be members of ENRS. Contributing authors/presenters are encouraged, but not required to be ENRS members.

All presenters are required to be paid registrants for the day of the conference on which they present. However, we do encourage presenters to register for the full ENRS Conference.

Abstract Layout:

Presentation Type: Clinical or community-based organization selected emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholar poster presentations will be ‘Poster’ only.

Clinical or community-based organization selected emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholars are welcome to submit their poster to the general peer-reviewed submission, but if accepted are only invited to present in one session, i.e., the clinical or community-based organization selected emerging clinical nurse researcher/scholar poster OR peer-reviewed poster session.

Research Status: The abstract submission will be classified as either “completed research” or “ongoing research” for each Clinical Nurse Researcher/Scholar poster.

ENRS Membership: The lead authors of all Clinical Nurse Researcher/Scholar poster presentations must be members of ENRS. Contributing authors/presenters are encouraged, but not required to be ENRS members. Online and downloadable ENRS membership applications are available at <http://www.enrs-go.org> and must be submitted and accepted prior to the abstract submission deadline.

All presenters are required to be paid registrants for the ENRS Conference.

Abstract Layout:

Presentation Type: Organization-selected poster presentations will be ‘Poster’ only.

Research Format: The content of each abstract must be organized under separate headings, according to one of the research formats listed below.

The **Quantitative** format should be used if you are unsure of the format.

Quantitative research format should include:

- Background/Purpose
- Theoretical Framework
- Methods (Design, Sample, Setting, Measures, Analysis)
- Results
- Conclusions & Implications

Qualitative research format should include:

- Theoretical Framework (if applicable)
- Background

- Purpose
- Methods (Design, Participants, Setting, Data Collection, Analytical Approach)
- Results
- Conclusions & Implications

Mixed Method research format should include:

- Theoretical Framework (if applicable)
- Background
- Purpose
- Methods (Design, Participants, Setting, Data Collection, Analytical Approach)
- Results
- Conclusions & Implications

Systematic/Integrative/Scoping Review research format should include:

- Theoretical Framework (if applicable)
- Background/Purpose
- Purpose
- Methods (Literature Search Strategy and Inclusion Criteria, Literature Review and Analysis)
- Results
- Conclusions & Implications

Translational research format should include:

- Theoretical Framework (if applicable)
- Background
- Purpose
- Methods (Design, Participants, Setting, Data Collection, Analytical Approach)
- Results
- Conclusions & Implications

Abstract Length: Abstracts must not exceed 2,500 characters Abstracts must not exceed 2,500 characters, including spaces, (approximately 300 words).

Keywords: Keywords will be used to further define the intended audience. Select your keyword(s) carefully as this is how your abstract will be grouped for presentation. Please select the major focus of your project as your primary keyword. If you are choosing a methods keyword as your primary focus, your abstract should be about developing/ refining a research method.

Please note: Your abstract will not be completed in the system until you click the “Finalize” button. You will then receive a confirmation email that your submission has been recognized as complete and submitted for review.

Poster Snapshot Submission:

Authors who have submitted their organization-selected poster abstracts by the November 16, 2021, deadline will need to submit a poster snapshot to be considered for an award in their category. Submitters will be contacted with these details at a later date.

Submission period for Clinical Nurse Researcher/Scholar Posters is through Tuesday, November 16, 2021.

Submissions received after the submission deadline date **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**
